Homework Help Has Begun! Homework Help will be held every Tuesday & Thursday 3:00 pm - 4:20 pm Snack will be provided

Student's who need a bus stop assignment for the late bus, which leaves campus at 4:30 must communicate this to a teacher on their team. The teacher will present the student's name and the Homework Help team will request a bus stop for the student. It may take up to one week before a bus stop is assigned from District. The student must wait to receive confirmation that a bus stop has been assigned before staying after school.

Car riders, walkers, and bike-riders must inform a parent that they are staying after school for Homework Help. Carriders must be picked up no later than 4:30 pm.
